

Objective/Teaching Points:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Importance of a proper scene size up • Request for additional resources (HazMat)
Setting:	Bathroom or janitor’s closet or some similar environment.
Dispatch:	Respond to the bathroom for difficulty breathing
Patient Instructions:	<p>You are the janitor performing routine cleanup duties in the bathroom when you begin to have difficulty breathing and become sluggish to confused.</p> <p>You are sitting on the floor in the bathroom several feet from the door but you are visible from the doorway. If the team chooses NOT to enter and calls for HazMat, I will declare the scene safe and allow them to enter and begin treatment.</p> <p>If team or any members enter the scene they will be declared dead and the scenario will be over.</p>
Props:	Spray bottle with 3/1 water to bleach solution. Cleaning props.
Initial Assessment:	
Scene Survey	Distinct odor of bleach in the air...very strong
General Impression	40 year old male in moderate distress
LOC	Alert but sluggish and confused
Airway	Open
Breathing	Labored
Circulation	As Observed
Any Immediate Tx Needed?	Contain HaxMat and call for additional resources
Focused History & Physical Exam:	
Appropriate Assessment Path	Rapid medical
Signs/Symptoms	Difficulty breathing and burning in the throat
Allergies	None
Meds	Allergy meds (Hay fever)
Past Pertinent Medical History	None
Last oral intake	Sandwich and apple 2 hours ago
Events leading to call	Cleaning bathroom
Vital Signs	As observed
Any Tx Needed Now?	Move to safe place and provide O2
Detailed Physical

Patient Status Now...Stable/Unstable?	Stable if removed from bathroom
2nd Set of Vitals	As observed
Patient Disposition	Recovers well
