

Objective/Teaching Points:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Demonstrate the ability to assess an unconscious patient found face down • Reinforce the “Roll-Don’t Roll” decision process
Setting:	Any location where a patient could have fallen from a height. Typically outside next to a building.
Dispatch:	Respond to a call for a fall victim near one of the buildings
Patient Instructions:	You were working on the roof of a building when someone witnessed you fall to the ground. You will be found face down and unconscious. I want you to breath normally and remain unconscious until you hear me say the words “ Has anyone called campus police? ” When you hear those words from ME, I want you to begin moaning and groaning and moving a little like you are beginning to wake up. As you come to, I want you to ask what happened and where you are and who are you?
Props:	Medic alert tag
Initial Assessment:	
Scene Survey	Safe
General Impression	As observed
LOC	Unconscious
Airway	Open
Breathing	Adequate
Circulation	Adequate
Any Immediate Tx Needed?	Stabilize head, O2, vitals
Focused History & Physical Exam:	
Appropriate Assessment Path	Rapid trauma assessment
Signs/Symptoms	As observed
Allergies	None
Meds	Phenobarbitol
Past Pertinent Medical History	Epileptic
Last oral intake	Haven’t eaten today
Events leading to call	Working on roof
Vital Signs	As observed
Any Tx Needed Now?	C-spine precautions and Patient assessment
Detailed Physical	
Indicate specific findings:	Hide two or three small objects (OPA, Bite stick, Marker pen) on the patients body to simulate deformities.
Ongoing Assessment:	
Patient Status Now...Stable/Unstable?	Unstable due to unconsciousness
